



Start a Plastic Free project at your school that can tie together various art forms (visual art, music, theater) with student action around reducing single-use plastics on campus. Here are some of the possible intersections:



### **Kōkua Hawai'i Foundation Plastic Free Hawai'i Mural Contest:**

Encourage your school to participate in the KHF Plastic Free Hawai'i Mural Contest. Deadline for submissions is February 20, 2016.

**Plastic Free Hawai'i Beach Cleanup:** Include all students in collecting material for their Plastic Free Mural by organizing a beach cleanup at a beach near your school. Include parents and community partners! You can also participate in Kōkua Hawai'i Foundation's quarterly Plastic Free Hawai'i beach cleanups. **Songwriting:** Have students write songs about their plastic free theme and/or message at their school. Integrate this into their mural project and have them perform it at a school assembly or at your school's organized beach cleanup.



**Honolulu Museum of Art *Plastic Fantastic?* Field Trip:** Plan for students to attend the *Plastic Fantastic?* art exhibit on display at the Spalding House from February 3 - July 10, 2016. *Plastic Fantastic?* focuses on plastic—its history, the scientific breakthroughs in its development as a material, and how it can be used to create water bottles to toothbrush handles, but also works of art.
